Topic Name:	MURSD Budget
Summary:	Current count for this School District: 2283 students, 162 teachers 305 staff. Dr Maruschek presents his budget for FY21, the goal, he says, is to "empower learners to thrive". He brings us back to 1995 in pictures and shows a comparison pointing out the new technology and how different life is now compared to then. After reviewing population and enrollment figures he shows a projected enrollment for FY21 with an approx. drop by 20 students. So, the Projected Budget is a 6.9% increase of \$2,537,768 from \$38,952,699 Dr discusses current staffing, and states among other needs, there is a need for 2 psychologists in house, we are currently contracting out for this need. He reviews current positions and the needs for each and where improvements are also needed but knowing that would kick the budget up reasonably he has left as is. This district is currently receiving state aid at an increase of 0.52%. Governor's

	budget giving \$304M to 35 districts for Chapter 70, Mendon getting \$30 per student.
	Mendon and Upton are 2 of the communities that are below their Target Share for municipal contribution. Dr shows a graph of over the years where the State sharing less and less aid to communities like Mendon. We knew this was coming, we know the issues that drive this, and Dr says he is working vehemently to find ways to save money or to spend less and not to burden the town with heavy money requests each year. But we are approaching top scale of the Chapter 70 aid to towns chart getting less and less each year.
