grant, bargain, sell and convey, unto the said Proprietors of Locust  
Hill Cemetery, heirs & assigns, the following described piece of land,  
situated in Mendon, & bounded as follows: Beginning at a corner,  
twelve feet north of the northeast corner of the School-House, District  
No. One, in Mendon, on the County Road leading from Mendon to  
Worcester, & running on said road, nineteen & half feet, to stake &  
stones, thence turning and running westerly, by land of grantor,  
to the centre of the wall, at the northeasterly corner of said cem-  
etery. The grantee to make & maintain the fence on the last line-  
thence turning and running by said cemetery, seventy-one & half  
feet, as the wall now stands, to land owned by said cemetery &

grant, bargain, sell and convey, unto the said Edward Bay, his heirs  
and assigns, a certain piece of land, situate in Warren, aforesaid, on
