

## **MEETING MINUTES**

- 1. Meeting called to order at 6:35 PM by chair Tom Merolli
- Discussed proposal from "Radical Solutions", a business which visited the Open For Business Breakfast, to provide energy aggregation for businesses in town.
  Committee decided to table this pending the outcome of a green energy aggregation plan currently being negotiated by the town.
- 3. The need for new members remains, as the board needs 4 for a quorum.
- 4. Seth Shurfro has not heard back from Rockland Trust about the potential for low interest bank loans for new businesses in town
- 5. Tom Merolli discussed the farm and animal tax, a tax which brings in a low amount of revenue. The board members present unanimously voted to support the abolition of this tax, and signed a letter indicating their support to do so.

- 6. Restaurant Week is still on for the first two weeks of June.
- 7. The Board of Selectmen are looking to appraise town owned land and would like the EDC's input on which parcels to appraise. Tom found 39 town owned parcels. The EDC decided of these, the ones that should be appraised are the three parcels on Rt. 16, the parcel on Providence St., and the empty building on Morrison Drive. Ann Mazar is putting together an RFP for the house lot owned by the town on Inman Hill Rd. She is also looking into whether or not the conservation restriction on the town owned lot on Rt. 16 can be moved.
- 8. Tom Merolli adjourned the meeting at 7:20 PM
